SUBJECT: Review of the Use of Voice Over Internet Protocol at NASA (Assignment No. A-05-025-00)

The NASA Office of Inspector General is terminating the subject assignment because the NASA Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) has been responsive overall to our concerns. We began the review in August 2005 to determine to what extent NASA was using Voice Over Internet Protocol (VOIP) and whether its implementation, including security measures, complied with Federal requirements.

Early in our review, we noted that NASA-wide requirements and guidance for implementing VOIP systems were not in place. Of particular concern, while multiple NASA Centers had begun implementing or were considering implementation of VOIP systems, we found limited, if any, coordination between those locations. Requirements and guidance for the coordination of NASA-wide VOIP implementations are critical to ensure that compatible technologies are used and that NASA's IT architecture is adhered to. Such coordination should result in a more reliable, robust, and cost-effective telephone system. Additionally, the NASA OCIO had not issued requirements for securing VOIP systems. As a result, we sent the Chief Information Officer a memorandum on September 30, 2005, which recommended that the OCIO issue the following:

1. Requirements and guidance for implementations of VOIP NASA-wide, including the coordination of implementations to ensure the use of compatible technologies and adherence to NASA's internet technology architecture.
2. Requirements and guidance for securing NASA's VOIP systems.

The Chief Information Officer's October 14, 2005, response (Enclosure 1) stated that management concurred with the recommendations and that the NASA OCIO would issue a directive to all NASA Centers concerning VOIP implementation and security. On October 25, 2005, the NASA Chief Information Officer issued a memorandum to all NASA Centers (Enclosure 2), which halted all work on VOIP implementations pending a review for compatibility, architecture adherence, and security. Also, the OCIO has incorporated VOIP security into the draft NASA Procedural Requirements 2810, "Security of Information Technology," which is now in the review process.

Based on these actions and our meetings with the OCIO, the latest of which took place on January 5, 2006, we concluded that the OCIO is taking responsive action to our recommendations and is moving in the right direction. All new VOIP implementations will require the approval of the NASA OCIO. In addition, a VOIP "community of interest," with representation from all NASA Centers and the NASA Integrated Services Network (NISN) began holding biweekly meetings on January 11, 2006. The community of interest will define an Agencywide architecture for VOIP at NASA. As part of our ongoing effort with the OCIO, we have been invited to review plans made by the community of interest and to monitor the implementation of the VOIP architecture.

Although we are terminating our review of VOIP, we will continue to work with the OCIO and the VOIP community of interest, and we will conduct follow-up activities on the recommendations we made in our September 30 memorandum.

SUBJECT: Response to Recommendations Regarding NASA-Wide Policy for Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) for Audit A-05-025-00, "Use of Voice Over Internet Protocol at NASA"

Following are management comments based on a memo sent September 30, 2005 regarding Audit A-05-025-00, "Use of Voice Over Internet Protocol at NASA," with the purpose of identifying the actions that will be taken concerning the recommendations made by the OIG.

OIG Recommendations for Corrective Action:

1. Requirements and guidance for implementation of VoIP NASA-wide, including the coordination of implementation to ensure the use of compatible technologies and adherence to NASA's IT architecture.

OCIO Response:

Concur: The Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) will issue a notice by October 25, 2005, to Center CIOs to stop all work on VoIP implementation until a review has been conducted by the OCIO for compatibility, architecture adherence, and security. The OCIO will issue a letter to all NASA Centers outlining a NASA-wide policy, including requirements and guidance by January 15, 2006.


2. Requirements and guidance for securing NASA's VoIP systems.

OCIO Response:

Concur: The OCIO will issue a notice by October 25, 2005 to Center CIOs to stop all work on VoIP implementations until a review has been conducted by the OCIO for compatibility, architecture adherence, and security. Also, the OCIO has incorporated VoIP security into the draft NPR 2810, "Security of Information

Technology,” now in the review process. All requirements and guidance has been drawn directly from the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Special Publication (SP) 800-58, “Security Considerations for Voice Over IP Systems” (January 2005). The revised NPR 2810 is expected to be released January 31, 2006.
